

## Maths

- Make a net for a pyramid.
- Go online and plan and a holiday to Egypt for you and your family. You must budget. Think about the hotel, flights, food, activities etc.
- Create your own hieroglyphic style symbols for numbers. Now create calculations by rolling a dice and writing them out in numbers and your symbols. Use + - X and ÷
- Find more Egyptian maths activities on the Maths tab on the home learning page.

- Create your own Egyptian themed board game and teach your family to play.
- The Egyptians loved making hand clapping songs (like pattercake). Create your own.
- Create your own Egyptian inspired dance.



- Create a sundial to go outside. How do you think the Egyptians used the sun and shadows to tell the time?
- Create a food chain of animals in Egypt.
- The hot air was important in the process of mummification. Investigate air and evaporation by making precious salt crystals. Instructions on this can be found online.

- Retell the story of Moses being sent down the river Nile using our Talk for Writing techniques (combining speech with actions to help you remember).

- Create a timeline of events. You can use a computer if you like.
- Research the foods they ate and create a menu (EXTRA CHALLENGE: Make the food).

- Draw and label your own map of Egypt.
- Find out the average temperature and rainfall in Egypt over the year and create graphs to show this.



## English

- Research the river Nile and create a fact file.
- Create a map of a pyramid and write instructions on how to escape.
- Write a newspaper report on the discovery of a tomb.
- Write an Egyptian themed poem or story.
- Pretend you are a historian searching for ancient Egyptian artefacts. Write a diary entry on what you found.
- Create a holiday brochure for Egypt.
- Write a diary of a day in the life of an Ancient Egyptian.



- Make your own Egyptian jewellery using things you have at home.
- Research hieroglyphics and spell your name or a secret message.
- Make your own pyramid.
- Create an Ancient Egyptian mask.
