## Pupil Premium at Wyburns



Pupil premium is a Government initiative that targets extra money at pupils from low income families and those adopted from care, ensuring support to enable them to reach their full potential.

Pupil Premium is allocated annually based on pupils who have registered for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years and those children recorded as adopted from December 2005.

The Government is not dictating how schools should spend this money, but are clear that schools will need to employ the strategies that they know will support their pupils to increase their attainment, and 'narrow the gap'. Schools will be accountable for narrowing the gap, and school performance tables will compare the attainment of pupils who receive the pupil premium with their peers.
